Call to Worship

This psalm describes the enmity of sinful man against God, and the violent revolt they would mount against His rule. Its final exhortation constitutes a call to us who trust Him to give Him our joyful adoration, which we will proceed to do.

We Acknowledge Our Sin

* Reading from the Law

God's law forbids anything which, by extension, leads to murder, including sinful anger.

Matthew 5:21-26 ESV

"You have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgment.' ²² But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment; whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, 'You fool!' will be liable to the hell of fire. ²³ So if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, ²⁴ leave your gift there before the altar and go. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift. ²⁵ Come to terms quickly with your accuser while you are going with him to court, lest your accuser hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the guard, and you be put in prison. ²⁶Truly, I say to you, you will never get out until you have paid the last penny. This prayer of confession centers on our sins of violence, and calls upon God as the author of peace to give us His peace, as Jesus promised (John 14:27).

O God of peace and love, we acknowledge before you the sinful rebellion of our hearts against you, reflected in the anger, frustration, quarreling, and selfish hostility toward others which we see in our hearts. We recognize that our violence, whether internal or external, is directed toward those who are created in your image, whom we have failed to respect and love as such, and ultimately toward you. We ask that, for the sake of Christ and his saving work on our behalf, bearing the violence of sinners, and indeed your violent justice, in our place, that you would forgive us these our transgressions, and all others, and that you would give us hearts of peace, that we might experience and revel in the peace we have with you, and be peacemakers among each other as we live in your world, for we pray in the name of the Prince of Peace.Amen.

WE REJOICE IN THE ASSURANCE OF FORGIVENESS

Assurance of Pardoning Grace

Peace with God is the foundation of all peace in heaven and on earth.

Romans 5:1, 2ESV

Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. ² Through him we have also obtained access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God.

Distribution of Elements

Because we believe that wine was used in the Last Supper and is thus more in accord with the fullness of symbolism intended by God in the Lord's Supper, we offer and encourage wine for those who take part in Communion. For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles.

"Mercy Speaks by Jesus' Blood"
