

The Big 10: Ten Guiding Principles for Personal Decision Making

- 1. Exclusivity -- My life is Jesus Christ's exclusively I am not my own!

 The Question to Ask: Is it my life or God's life? 1 Corinthians 6:19-20
- 2. Expediency -- I have the freedom to do a lot of things, but doing so may not be best for me.

The Question to Ask: Does this help me? 1 Corinthians 6:12a

3. Enslavement -- I have the freedom to do a lot of things, but doing so may enslave me.

The Question to Ask: Does this control me? 1 Corinthians 6:12b

4. Edification -- I have freedom to do a lot of things, but doing so may not build up me or others.

The Question to Ask: Does this build up me or others? 1 Corinthians 10:23

5. Exaltation -- The focus of my decision making is not on what most pleases me, but what most pleases and glorifies God.

The Question to Ask: Does this bring glory to God? 1 Corinthians 10:31

6. Endangerment -- With all the liberty I have in Christ, I don't have the liberty to hinder another believer's growth.

The Question to Ask: Does this have the potential to hurt the spiritual progress of others? 1 Corinthians 8:4-13

7. Equivocation -- If it's doubtful, don't do it.

The Question to Ask: Do I have any doubts about this? Romans 14:12, 15-16, 22-23

8. Evaluation -- I have to be willing to evaluate the association or appearance of every area of my life.

The Question to Ask: Am I willing to let go of anything that has a questionable association with or appearance of evil? 1 Thessalonians 5:21-22

9. Anticipation -- If you don't want to fall, stay out of slippery places.

The Question to Ask: How can I avoid slippery places? Romans 13:14; Proverbs 22:3

10. Transformation -- Every decision either makes me more conformed to the world or more transformed to please Christ.

The Question to Ask: Is this conforming me to be like the world or transforming me to be like the Lord? Romans 12:1-2

In every decision you make remember what Jesus said: "If ye love me, keep my commandments (John 14:15)."

Obedience-driven decision making is a matter of love!
