DANIEL'S DREAM OF COMING KINGDOMS (Daniel 7:1-14)

A. The Setting & Context of Daniel's Dream (7:1-3)
1. Daniel was given a dream of divine revelation about the future in B.C., the first year of the Babylonian king Belshazzar, which means Daniel was given the revelation in chapters 7–8 the historical events of chapters 5–6. (v. 1)

B. The Four Beastly Kingdoms (7:4-8, 17)
1. BEAST #1 (v. 4): A with wings symbolized King Nebuchadnezzar and the Babylonian Empire which was swift on the battlefield. (Jer. 49:19, 22; 50:17; Lam. 4:19)
2. BEAST #2 (v. 5): A represented the Medo-Persian Empire which wasn't as fleet footed as a lion, but still just as ferocious. (Isa. 13:17-18)
3. BEAST #3 (v. 6): A, known for its cunningness and swiftness, aptly represented the Greek Empire.
4. BEAST #4 (v. 7): This beast is unique and not represented by any living animal, but it symbolizes the Roman Empire.
