(28) So ought men to love their wives as their own bodies. He that loveth his wife loveth himself. (29) For no man ever yet hated his own flesh; but nourisheth and cherisheth it, even as the Lord the church: (30) For we are members of his body, of his flesh, and of his bones. (31) For this cause shall a man leave his father and mother, ans shall be joined unto his wife, and they two shall be one flesh. (32) This is a great mystery: but I speak concerning Christ and the church. (33) Nevertheless let every one of you in particular so love his wie even as himself; and the wife see that she reverence her husband."

PLEASE BE SEATED

"It's a wonderful privilege to gather together to witness the marriage covenant of Kelli Nicole Recod and Jeffrey Brandon Wadsworth. What God is doing here today is of great significance. The marriage relationship was ordained by God on the sixth day of creation when God created Adam and from Adam fashioned Eve to be a helper suitable for him.

Kelli, Adam was alone, and in him was something that incomplete. God brought Eve to him, to be a completer....to be one who took up where he left off. God is doing that very same thing for Jeff today by bringing you to him. What a privilege that is and what a responsibility!

So Paul, in this passage helps us understand the weight of what we are doing here today as he explains how the marriage relationship shows us a picture of the relationship between Christ and His church.

This relationship is a **distinct** relationship. And that is why he quotes from Genesis 2:24 when he says, *Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife, and they two shall become one flesh.*

"We're going to witness a **leaving** today—therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother—not just a physical leaving, but an emotional leaving. This relationship now will interrupt everything else in their lives. The relationships that they have with others will not be any longer exactly the same, because of the devotion they now promise to one another.

"And there will be a **cleaving**—and shall cleave unto his wife—Jeff and Kelli are uniting to form a unique and distinct family unit in which we trust that God will be glorified and through which godly children will be raised up after them.

"And, finally, Jeff and Kelli shall become one —and they two shall become one flesh. There's a leaving and a cleaving and a weaving of their lives together that will become more intimate as they grow in the Lord and with one another.

But let us be clear on the lesson that this realtionship teaches everyone involved.

"Marriage is also an illustration of Christ's love for His church. Ephesians 5:25 says, *Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her.*

There was a time when this man set his eye upon this woman and determined in heis heart that he would pursue her as a wife. In the same way, Christ has pursued us, the sinner. And He has determined to love us and have a relationship with us through the work of His life and death on the cross.

Jeff, as you show Kelli love and help she should better understand her Savior's love for her. And as you serve together, your relationship should stand as an illustration to others of Christ and His bride.

"So, what we do here today is of immense significance and, while we rejoice, we rejoice reverently, mindful of the grace and majesty and purpose of God and of Christ's love for His church.

"Jeff and Kelli, it is my privilege to count you as friends. It has been a joy in these last few weeks to listen to you share what God has done in your lives and how He has led you to this commitment. I'm confident that, by the grace of God, you will strive to bring glory to God through your marriage as you fulfill your divinely-ordained roles for each other. I speak for everyone by saying that we're excited for you and pray for God's richest blessing on your lives together."

POURING OF THE UNITY SAND

"This sand is a symbol of what Jeff and Kelli are doing today. Again, the Bible teaches that, in marriage, "the two become one." Until coming together today, their lives have been lived independently as they have sought to follow God's will and live for Him. But, believing that they can follow the Lord and serve Him more perfectly together, they are saying goodbye to their former, individual lives and uniting to form one life. From now on, they will devote themselves to the Lord as one, living in

companionship and harmony with each other and together finding their ultimate joy in their Savior, Jesus Christ."
