Closing Thought: The Apostles were ordinary men that God used in extraordinary ways. God used a strong, bold leader, like Peter, who had to be rebuked because of his pride. He used a humble, gentle man like Andrew, who stayed in the background and brought people to meet Jesus. Then there was James, the Son of Thunder, aggressive, passionate, insensitive, and ambitious that God used. His brother John, a seeker of
