

John And His Mission Luke 3:1–6

John was significant because of his relationship to Christ.

John's mission was significant because of it's relationship to the word of God.

John's life was defined, explained and justified by the scriptures.

- Gabriel defined who John would be by Malachi 4:5–6 (Luke 1:17).
- Zacharias defined John's mission by referring to Malachi 3:1 (Luke 1:76).
- John referred to Isaiah 40:1–5 to justify what he was doing (John 1:23).
- Jesus guoted Malachi 3:1 and 4:5 to explain John's ministry (Matthew 11:10–14).
- The four gospel writers state that John fulfilled these three scriptures.

Brother and sister, our lives must be defined, explained, and justified by the scriptures.

John's mission was defined by three Old Testament scriptures.

- John was the messenger who announced the coming of the Lord Malachi 3:1
- The messenger announced the salvation and judgment of God.
- John was Elijah who proceeded the coming of Messiah Malachi 4:5–6
- Elijah would proceed the salvation and judgment of God.
- John was the voice of one crying in the wilderness Isaiah 40:3-5
- The voice would cry out the salvation and judgment of God.
- Chapters 40 through 66 of Isaiah reveal the Consolation of Israel.
- The cry comes in three parts: 1) **40:3–48:22** The salvation of Israel; 2) **49:1–57:21** The Messiah; 3) **58:1–66:24** The Millennial Kingdom

John's mission was to prepare people for the coming of the Messiah.

- Why did God have to send someone before Him to prepare the people?
- Because people are not prepared to meet the Lord and if He comes upon the unprepared then the unprepared will be judged - Luke 3:17
- The voice of one crying is a strong and intense call which demands attention.
- Crying in the wilderness is outside the comforts of a sinful lifestyle. The wilderness is the
 difficult way full of obstacles and impossibilities.
- Make His paths straight is making ready a clear and true and right pathway.
- Filling valleys, lowering mountains, and straightening crooked places means doing whatever it takes to clear out a road.
- Prepare the way of the Lord means removing any obstacle in the way of the Lord.
- The obstacle of sin must be removed from the heart so that the Lord can enter in.
- John's mission was to prepare people to receive Christ by preaching repentance.

John's mission of preparing souls for the coming of Jesus Christ continues today. Some need to be prepared.

Some are the ones preparing others.
