MISSIONARY OF THE WEEK

Anthony Forrest is the Reformed University Fellowship (RUF) campus pastor at Jackson State University. In his first letter to us last spring, Anthony said, "We were all saying 'goodbye' until after Spring Break, but we had no way of knowing that it would be such a long time!" He said that, during the past year, he and his students have been reminded of "how precious our moments together are—and how gracious God, who knows all, is to give them to us."

Later in the school year, Anthony said, "We deeply miss our students." He said they so quickly become "ours as we give and pour out daily into their lives. To know that you are praying for us and our campus is strengthening."

Anthony wrote this month to share about a different 'storm' that hit them. The winter storm that brought the severe water problems to Jackson resulted in much of JSU being closed to foot traffic. Anthony said that, after the snow and ice melted away, some of the students left, deciding to continue the semester elsewhere.

"The winds came through and really shook up an already fragile situation—for students and faculty alike." But Anthony told us that he knows that "Christ can calm the wind and has a way of making things clear when questions arise and we get trapped in the uncertainly in our heads."

Please pray for Anthony and his students at Jackson State as they trust in the Lord during these very difficult times.
