Call to Worship

This psalm calls us to worship on the basis of the contrast between the rule of fallen men, who are in reality expressions of the kingdom and rebellion of Satan, and the rule of God (which is also ultimately through redeemed mankind through Christ), which results in blessings of all kinds to human beings.

Here we sing of our awareness of our guilt, and of our flight to the only One who offers us hope and can save us. But notice that the rest of the hymn sets forth the written Word of God avenue to our hope and that which leads us to Him and to Christ. This hymn then beautifully juxtaposes both our failure to seek God in His Word and the repentance wrought by His opening of our eyes which leads us to seek Him diligently in that same Word.

Distribution of Elements

For those with conscientious convictions against the use of wine, however, we offer grape juice, which is contained in the inner circle of the communion trays. The cups containing wine are in the outer circles.
