A Good Report

• They were <u>continuing</u> to follow Jesus – as evidenced by their faith and love.

Hebrews 11:25–27 (NIV) – *He chose to be* mistreated along with the people of God rather than to enjoy the fleeting pleasures of sin. ²⁶ He regarded disgrace for the sake of Christ as of greater value than the treasures of Egypt, because he was looking ahead to his reward. ²⁷ By faith he left Egypt, not fearing the king's anger; he persevered because he saw him who is invisible.

A Good Report

- They were <u>continuing</u> to follow Jesus as evidenced by their faith and love.
- They thought well of <u>Paul</u> and longed to see him.

A Growing Request

- 1. We should continue to grow in <u>faith</u>.
- 2. We should increase and abound in love.

a. This love is informed by our relationship to our God and <u>Father</u>.

- b. This love is achieved through the work of <u>Jesus</u> our Master.
- c. This love should grow in <u>intensity</u> and <u>scope</u>.

d. This love should be directed to both <u>believers</u> and <u>unbelievers</u>.

- e. This love requires us to <u>sacrifice</u> for the good of others.
- f. This love is the means by which the believer is <u>prepared</u> to stand before God.
- g. This love is motivated by the sobering <u>return</u> of Jesus.

Revelation 2:1–4 (NIV) To the angel of the church in Ephesus write: These are the words of him who holds the seven stars in his right hand and walks among the seven golden lampstands. ² I know your deeds, your hard work and your perseverance.

I know that you cannot tolerate wicked people, that you have tested those who claim to be apostles but are not, and have found them false. ³ You have persevered and have endured hardships for my name, and have not grown weary. ⁴ Yet I hold this against you: You have forsaken the love you had at first.
